- Malta Cross Gold Filigree Museum (MCGFM) will be protected by a trademark.


The process explained 2/2

- Kevin will replace every single piece sold with a new, different piece of filigree.
- Nobody will be allowed to buy out the complete collection in its entirety. A potential buyer can nonetheless
 purchase all the pieces progressively, to prevent the museum from being depleted.
- The 250 shares of €1000 each will be converted into shadow equity of a limited liability company, MCGFM Ltd.
- Your investment will be represented as a determined number of grams of gold, in direct relation to the amount you invested.

Gold Prices - 100 Year Historical Chart




What artwork will we found in the Maltese Cross Gold Filigree Museum?
